The Chair **welcomed** everyone to the meeting.

Apologies were **RECEIVED** from Marcus Longley, Chair; Sharon Hopkins, Chief Executive; Alan Lawrie, Director of Primary, Community & Mental Health Services and Liz Wilkinson, Director of Therapies & Health Sciences.

UHB/B/20/036 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

UHB/B/20/037 PRINCE CHARLES HOSPITAL GROUND & FIRST FLOOR PROJECT PHASE 2 BUSINESS CASE - AMENDMENTS FROM SUBMITTED FBC

S Webster introduced the report and advised that the report which was being discussed in closed session due to commercial sensitivity issues.

The Director of Finance & Procurement reminded Board Members that the Full Business Case for the project had been approved by the Board in March 2019 but had since undergone a number of amendments and changes. Members **NOTED** these related to a revised bed decanting strategy, changes in rates requested by the contractor, a revised budget associated with re-market testing and the financial standing of the contractor.

I Worby took Board Members through the key issues relating to these changes.

Board Members **NOTED** that this project represented a significantly challenging project in terms of construction activity and would fully utilise the remaining space on the Prince Charles Hospital site.

G Dix sought clarity that colleagues in the field of Infection Prevention & Control had been fully engaged in discussions around this project. Iain Worby confirmed this to be the case and that funding had now been agreed to appoint an additional Infection Protection & Control Nurse to become an integral part of the project planning team.

S Webster stated that there would be an increase in revenue costs which was unavoidable but that the finished project would bring about overall greater efficiency and this issue would be factored into future planning. Board Members **NOTED** that CTMUHB would be reimbursed for historical fees. S Webster stated if the Board approved the case, the Welsh Government was currently due to consider the Full Business Case during the final week of March 2020. The projected start on site date was 18 May 2020 however Board Members **NOTED** this was subject to any impact arising from the COVID-19 Pandemic.

M Jehu stated that on the basis this project represented the best option in the circumstances he supported it being progressed. D Jouvenat concurred advising that the report provided the necessary confidence.
