**1. SITUATION/BACKGROUND**

- 1.1 It is broadly accepted that the duty of the Health Board to improve the health of its population effectively makes it more than a healthcare organisation delivering reactive healthcare services.



- 1.2 A population health organisation takes responsibility for improving the health of an entire population, not just of those who are care-seeking.
- 1.3 During April 2021, the Board held two sessions at which it discussed what it meant to be a population health organisation. Those discussions led to a number of high-level opportunities being identified.
- 1.4 This paper builds on those conversations by defining more specifically the potential opportunities available to the Health Board to embed a population health ethos in the organisation and secure continuous improvement in the health of the Cwm Taf Morgannwg population
