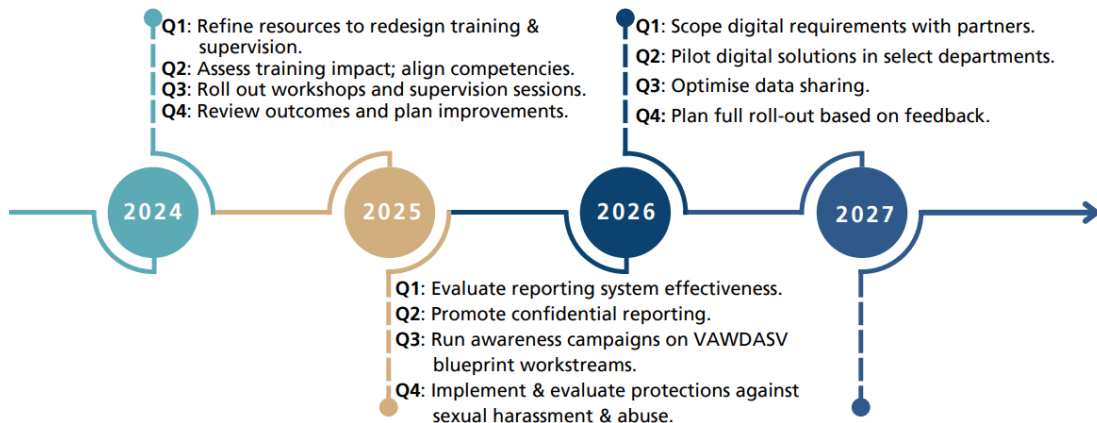

1. Situation /Background

- 1.1 The Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board (CTMUHB) annual report has been produced to reflect how it has achieved its outcomes against the three year strategic plan and the associated priorities agreed to as in partnership with the Cwm Taf Morgannwg Regional Safeguarding Board (CTMSB). The report also summarises and aims to inform the public and other practitioners of how priorities for the year have been achieved and learning from inspections/reviews integrated into practice.

2. Specific Matters for Consideration

- 2.1 The Health Board's Safeguarding Annual Report (Appendix A – available within the papers for the [Quality, Safety and Experience Committee held on 18 November 2025](#)) has been produced to give an overview of the safeguarding activity undertaken throughout the health board in 2024/2025. Reflecting learning and actions taken from Single Unified Safeguarding reviews, incidents and concerns. The report demonstrates the effective leadership, commitment and operational support in all aspects of Safeguarding and Public Protection across Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board and how the Health Board complies with legislation, external standards and good practice guidance.
- 2.2 The Cwm Taf Morgannwg Safeguarding Board (Appendix B – available within the papers for the [Quality, Safety & Experience Committee held on 18 November 2025](#)) has also produced an Annual Report for 2024/2025, this has been produced to reflect multi-agency safeguarding activity across Cwm Taf Morgannwg. All partner agencies have contributed to the board work and worked collaboratively to meet the objectives and priorities of the Boards' strategic plans. This Annual Report presents an overview of the work that the Cwm Taf Morgannwg Safeguarding Board carried out in 2024/2025 in pursuit of the aim to ensure that the people of Cwm Taf Morgannwg are safeguarded from abuse, neglect or other forms of harm.
- 2.3 In addition to working toward regional priorities, the corporate safeguarding team have also collaborated with the National Safeguarding Service through its implementation groups, to deliver on recommendations set out in the "Strengthening Safeguarding in Health Review" conducted in 2024 & commissioned by Welsh Government.
- 2.4 The health board's three year safeguarding strategic plan positions the priorities for the next three years. For 2024/2025 the priorities are detailed in the below diagram.



3. Key Risks / Matters for Escalation

- 3.1 Key areas of work undertaken this year have included the implementation of the all Wales safeguarding supervision policy. This incorporated the development of a CTMUHB policy, supervision request forms and supervision feedback forms to enable quality assurance in respect of advice and support offered to practitioners.
- 3.2 In collaboration with the School Nursing service, a safeguarding standard operating procedure was developed. Thus ensuring that the health board evidence an appropriate response to the recommendations set out within the Joint Inspection for Child Protection Arrangements (JICPA) and safeguarding rapid review undertaken by Care Inspectorate Wales (CIW) and Health Inspectorate Wales (HIW).
- 3.3 An annual audit plan was undertaken across multiple services to provide assurance that the health board appropriately respond to safeguarding concerns, can identify opportunities for early intervention and evidence duty to report in line with the Social Services and Well being (Wales) Act 2014
- 3.4 Data collection and subsequent dashboards have been adapted to align with the agreed national safeguarding metrics required by Welsh Government. This data collection will be further strengthened once all health boards in Wales fully embed the Once for Wales safeguarding module.
- 3.5 In July this year the safeguarding team restructured to include all Clinical Nurse Specialists for safeguarding from the Children and Families Care Group. This has ensured a coordinated and collaborative approach to safeguarding across services, professional development and quality improvement. This has been successful, demonstrated through a whole team approach. In addition, the re structure ensured opportunity for the appointment of a dedicated practice educator for safeguarding.



3.6 With recurrent funding from Welsh Government, a continued effort has been made to reduce the Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards backlog and Mental Capacity Act awareness throughout the organisation. This funding has also enabled recruitment of a Court of Protection Lead.
